The fall sports seasons are coming to a close. The High School volleyball team is tied for first with St. Paul and will likely have a showdown with the Buckaroos at the Casco League Tournament on Saturday October 29th. If the girls win the final two matches of the season they are assured a state playoff berth as the 1st or 2nd seed. Either way we will be hosting a state playoff game on Wednesday November 2nd or Saturday November 5th.

The Middle School volleyball girls are currently undefeated including big wins over Dayton, YC, and Willamina. The coaches and players have raised the level of play and are dominating 3A competition. Awesome!

The Middle School football team avenged an early $26-20$ loss to Kings Way with a 42-22 win late in the season. The season highlight is a $66-6$ win at St. Paul which was dominated by the Pirates from start to finish. The team will finish the season 5-1 and the unofficial league champion!

The Varsity football team is now ranked \#1 in the state and is undefeated. A showdown at St. Paul will decide the league championship and affect playoff seeding. This team will contend for a state title in November and December so be ready to come support this team at St. Paul on October 28th and throughout the playoffs.

 vegetable marketing system that grows, cleans, packages and ships these products around the western U.S.

Food For All sent $210,000 \mathrm{lbs}$. of food last year to more than 3,500 families. This year we want to make Food For All truly a "Perrydale" community event. Yes, we want your help. "How" you ask? Let me tell you!

1. Come gather food with us. We will have a bus on December $5^{\text {th }}$.
2. Bring cookies and hot chocolate to the kids while packing or loading trucks - December $6^{\text {th }}-16^{\text {th }}$
3. Come down to the school from 9:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. and assist kids in their work - December $6^{\text {th }}-16^{\text {th }}$
4. Make the trip to deliver food - December $15^{\text {th }}$ and $16^{\text {th }}$.

Graduation Requirement Changes for those Graduating in 2012 (Seniors this year)

Changes in the Oregon High School Diploma requirements are being phased in over a 5 year period. We have already adapted to an increase in one English and one Math credit and in 2012 will add another Science credit requirement. We are so thankful we have excellent teachers, new curriculum and a new science lab so we are adapting to the new requirements easily at Perrydale.

Starting in 2012 the State of Oregon will also require all students to demonstrate they are proficient in certain "essential skills" - skills that are deemed critical for future success - before they are awarded a diploma. The first requirement to be phased in will be the demonstration of proficiency in the area of reading. Students will have a variety of opportunities to demonstrate this proficiency - the most common way will be to pass OAKS (state assessment) or earn at least a score of 44 in reading on the PSAT.
